3. Read Luke 6:22–23. Consider what it looks like to rejoice and leap for joy when you are reviled by others? What would being hated and reviled look like today, compared to in the 1 st century?

4. Read Luke 6:24-26. Which of these woes stand out to you the most?

5. How do you answer these questions:

a. Do I feel in my heart that everything that I have comes from God?

b. When something unexpected comes my way, do I reach for my Bible or my wallet?

c. When I need wisdom, do I seek God in prayer, or call seek Google?

d. Would I give up my comfort, and my stuff, if it meant having Jesus?

e. Do I soften my Christianity around certain people so that they will like me more?

6. How do you balance Luke 6:26 with other passages like Romans 12:18, 1 Timothy 3:7, and 1 Peter 2:12. How are we to behave in the world? How should we aim to be thought of?
