## FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

- 1. What are some wrong ways that sometimes we view suffering? According to 1 Peter 4:12, how should we view suffering and trials?
- 2. Explain how the picture of a refiner's fire helps us understand our suffering. (see 1 Peter 1:6-7, Malachi 3:1-5, Isa 48:10, Zech 13:7-19, Jer 2:27-28).
- 3. Have you ever faced persecution or suffering for Christ? How have you seen God use suffering to shape your character throughout your life?
- 4. Read 1 Peter 4:12-14. Why do you think Peter encourages his readers to not be surprised? What does surprise at suffering indicate?
- 5. What encouragements does Peter offer in 4:12-14 that allow us to rejoice in the midst of suffering? See also Acts 5:40-41, 16:24-25; Phil 3:10; Col 1:24; Rom 5:3-4; James 1:2-3, 1:12; 2 Cor 4:17, 12:9.
- 6. What suffering have you been dealing with recently that God wants to use in your life to refine you? What is the furnace in your life?
- 7. How can suffering cause us to be tempted to sin? How does 1 Peter 4:15-18 relate present suffering and coming judgment (see Zech 13:7-9; Mal 3:1-5)
- 8. Read 1 Peter 4:19. This week how can you entrust your soul to God? What good might He call you to in the midst of this?
