Mark 3:31-35

Being part of Jesus' <u>FAMILY</u> matters far more than <u>EARTHLY</u> family.

Being part of Jesus' family means <u>RECOGNIZING</u> that He is the <u>UNIQUE</u> Son of God.

• Being part of Jesus' family means <u>ALIGNING</u> our lives with His MISSION.

 Being part of Jesus' family means living in <u>OBEDIENCE</u> to Him.

- 1. How can our earthly families be both challenging to our faith and an encouragement to our faith in Jesus?
- 2. Read Mark 3:31-35. How do you think a first century Jewish audience would have felt about Jesus' words? How do you feel about Jesus' words—do they seem insensitive or uncaring? Why?
- 3. How is the promise of Mark 3:34-35 comforting to you? How has Jesus' church been a family to you?
- 4. What are some ways in our culture that we elevate our families to a place that should only be reserved for God? What does it look like to make God our first allegiance even above our families? (Matthew 10:34-39; Luke 14:26; Luke 18:28-30; Mark 10:28-30)
- 5. Why do you think Mark brackets the story of Jesus' family coming to seize him around the story about blasphemy against the Holy Spirit? Read Mark 3:21-35. How is the sin of the scribes similar to the sin of Jesus' family?
- 6. How are you tempted to ask Jesus join your mission instead of aligning your life with His mission?
- 7. What does it look like for your family be an extension of Jesus' church and a place where discipleship happens? What does it look like to prioritize building your family into Jesus' church? See 2 Tim 1:5; 2 Tim 3:14-15; Heb 13:1-2; 1 Pet 4:9; Deut 6:4-9; Eph 5:25-30; Tit 2:3-5; Heb 10:24-25
- 8. Read Mark 3:33-35. How is obedience to the will of God a marker of being part of God's family? How do you see the relationship between obedience and faith? How do you see obedience in Jesus' life? See John 4:34: Mark 14:36: Luke 11:27-28
