- 2. Read a little bit about Silvanus/Silas (see Acts 15:22-27, 32; 39-40; 16:19-31; 17:14-15; 1 Thes 1:1). How can you be a Silvanus to those around you?
- 3. Read 1 Peter 5:13. How is the description in this verse similar to 1 Peter 1:1-2? How have you seen these same theme throughout the book of 1 Peter?
- 4. How is it helpful to think about what other Christians in the world are facing? Is there a particular place in the world where you've been concerned for other Christians lately? As a group, take a moment to open operationworld.org, read the current prayer request and pray for this country.
- 5. Read 1 Peter 5:14. How should we live out the command in this verse?
- 6. How do you understand the concept of peace in 1 Peter 5:14? How does this peace bind us together as Christians? (see Eph 2:13-16; Col 3:15; Isa 53:5; Rom 5:1; Eze 34:25; John 10:16; John 14:27, 16:33)
- 7. Thinking back over our entire study of 1 Peter, what has been impactful in your life? How can you continue to stand in this?
