- Salvation from judgment requires a SUBSTITUTIONARY SACRIFICE.
- We are saved in order to be SANCTIFIED.
- Our salvation must be REMEMBERED continually.
- We must INDIVIDUALLY put our FAITH in Christ for salvation.

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FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

1. How is it true in Exodus that the Lord's judgment saves his people? How is this true in our lives?
2. Read Exodus 12:12-13. How does this plague differ from the others? How does the Presence of the Lord change everything?
3. In Exodus 12:13, why did God seeing the blood cause Him to pass over the home? How does this apply to Christians? What does this tell us about how we should view ourselves and the world? (see Rom 3:23-26; Eph 1:7; Heb 10:4, 10-13; 1 Pet 1:18-19; John 1:29; 1 John 1:7; 2:2; 4:10)
4. Read Exodus 12:11. What is the meaning of the manner in which they were to eat?
5. Read Exodus 12:14-20. How does this speak of us growing in purity and holiness?
6. What's the relationship between sanctification and justification? (see Heb 9:14; 10:14; 12:10; 1 Cor 5:6-8)
7. In your life, what are some things that help you remember your deliverance from sin through the gospel? How important is remembering what God's done for us? (see Psalm 103:1-5; Deut 6:10-12)
8. In your life, how can you live more fully by faith in the new life you have in Christ?
