• We are rescued into a BATTLE. 17:8

• We must <u>FIGHT</u> the battle, but the battle does not DEPEND on us. 17:9-10

• The battle depends on the One who <u>STANDS</u> before God for us on a <u>HILL</u> with <u>ARMS</u> outstretched. 17:10-13

• We need to <u>REMEMBER</u> our dependence on the Lord amidst the battle. 17:14-16

- 3. What does the battle metaphor teach us about our lives as Christians (see | Tim | 1:18-19; | Tim | 6:12; 22 Tim | 2:3; 2 Cor | 10:3-6; Eph | 6:13-18)? Other passages?
- 4. Read Exodus 17:8-10. What does it look like to "get in the battle" of the Christian life? What does it look like to be in a battle without realizing it? (see Ps 42:1-2; Phil 3:8-11; 3:12)
- 5. Read Exodus 17:9-11. What does the staff of Moses represent? What does this teach us about our battle as Christians?
- 6. What's the difference in fighting <u>for</u> victory or fighting <u>from</u> victory? How does this change the battle? (see Heb 7:25; Heb 12:1-2)
- 7. How has Jesus accomplished victory (see Col 2:15; Gal 6:14; Rom 6:6)?
- 8. Read Exodus 17:13-16. What is the significance of a banner? How does it impact your life to know that the Lord is your banner?
