4. Reading over Exodus 19:8-15, what do you think God is trying to teach the people of Israel? What can we learn from this?
5. How should we prepare for the final trumpet sounding? (optional verses: Matt 24:31; 1 Cor 15:52; 1 Thes 4:16; Rev 11:15)
6. Read Exodus 19:16-20. What do you think this was like? What do you take away from this scene? What is the significance of smoke?
7. Considering Hebrews 12:18-24, how do you think we should approach our Sunday morning service? What should be central? What should be our attitude? Why? (For additional thoughts, see Hebrews 10:19-25; 2 Tim 4:1-2; Acts 2:42-47)
8. How is Moses functioning as a mediator in this passage? How does this point to Jesus? (see 1 Tim 2:5-6)
9. How does it encourage you to know that God's fiery Presence dwells in you (see Acts 2:2-4)?
