- The tabernacle shows us that God desires a <u>RELATIONSHIP</u> with His people.
 - $\circ~$ The tabernacle shows us God's <u>HOLINESS</u>.
 - $\circ~$ The tabernacle shows us that we must live by <u>FAITH</u>, not by sight.
 - $\circ~$ The tabernacle shows us the \underline{VALUE} of God's Presence in JESUS.
- The bronze altar shows us that a <u>SACRIFICE</u> is necessary for relationship with God.

• The constant, pure light in the tabernacle shows us the <u>CONSTANCY</u> of God's Presence.
