FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

1. Do you find value in the repetition of the lists of tabernacle pieces? How are the lists in Exodus 25-30 and Exodus 37-39 different? How are they the same? Why?
2. The tabernacle and the courtyard both had a single, clearly marked, entrance. This signified the way to come and meet with God. Jesus says in John 14:6 that He is the only "entrance" to the Father. What does this single way to God tell us about Him? In what ways are we tempted to try to find a back door? What compromises might we make?
3. The Israelites kept a detailed record of the contributions for the tabernacle. How is this honoring to God? How can we apply this truth to our daily lives? Colossians 3:23. 1 Corinthians 10:31
4. Why do you think that God collected the materials for the Tabernacle from the Israelites rather than simply providing them, like He had the manna from Heaven or the water from the rock? What does this tell us about God and how He accomplishes His plan? Ephesians 2:10
5. What do you find most notable about the priestly garments? What is the significance of the stones on the shoulders and in the breastpiece? Exodus 39:6-13
6. In what ways does Jesus Christ perfect the office of high priest? Hebrews 4:15-16, 7:23-25, 26-28, 8:1-2, 9:12, 14, 24
7. How are we to perform the priestly duties of prayer/intercession and sacrifice? Ezekiel 22:30, Romans 12:1, Hebrews 13:15
8. What is the nature of the inspection that we will undergo? How can we hope to pass that inspection? Matthew 25:31-34, 2 Corinthians 5:10, Revelation 22:12
