THE KEY TO REJOICING

Romans 5:1–11

The key to rejoicing is <u>UNDERSTANDING</u> the <u>GOSPEL</u>.

We rejoice in <u>HOPE</u> of the glory of God - because we <u>STAND</u> in Peace and Grace.

We rejoice in our <u>HOPE</u> — because we have been <u>SEALED</u> in love by His Spirit.

Suffering is used by God to make you a **<u>CHARACTER WITNESS.</u>**

Suffering is used by God to make you look like <u>CHRIST</u>.

We rejoice in our <u>**RECONCILIATION**</u> to God — because we have been <u>**SAVED**</u> through Christ.
