III. By the Glory of God, we <u>walk</u> in a new life to <u>enjoy</u> the resurrected Jesus forever.

FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

- 1. Are people born basically good or basically evil?
- Read Romans 5:18-6:4. How do you see sin prior to faith in Jesus? Compare it with this passage and how we are to view our sin now. 2 Cor. 5:16-18, 21
- 3. Is our freedom in Christ a license to sin? Discuss how the Gospel message is not antinomianism. Isaiah 55:6-7, Galatians 5:13
- 4. Discuss the difference between repentance and regret. Read Hebrews 12:12-17, was Esau and example of regret or repentance?
- Do Christians still sin? What is the difference between a believer's sin and an unbeliever's sin? 2 Cor. 7:9-10, 1 John 1:8, 2:1,29, 3:4-10.
- 6. Romans 6:3-4 says we were "baptized into his death". What does this mean? Discuss what baptism is and what it is not. 2 Cor. 5:14-15, Col. 2:12-14, 20, Gal. 2:19-20.
- 7. Read Rom. 6:1-4 again. How does this give you hope in your daily walk with Jesus? Discuss what hope we have for eternity because of our identity in Christ. 1 Peter 2:24, Jude 1: 24-25, Titus 3: 1-7, Eph. 2:4-7, Rom. 11:29.
