## FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

- 1. Discuss what you think of when you hear the word "Israel."
- 2. What is the "problem of Israel" and how does it relate to v. 6?
- 3. What is the difference between a collectivistic vs. individualistic culture? How does this help us understand Paul's audience in Romans?
- 4. How do you see Paul's passion for unbelieving Israel? How do you respond to and view those that are not believers? Should we have his sorrow and passion?
- 5. Discuss the various things listed by Paul that "belong" to the Israelites in verses 4 & 5. Discuss how these things were confused with salvation for Israelites. Review Romans 3:21-4:12. How was Abraham justified and reconciled with God?
- In v. 6 he states: "But it is not as though the word of God has failed." How do you understand this? Why is the important case he is trying to make about Israel in chapters 9-11? Isaiah 40:8, Gal. 3:7-9, Acts 28: 26-28.
- 7. Read Romans 9:6-13. How does this help you understand God's election of Israel?
- 8. Discuss the concept of "election." How does this give us confidence in God's plans? Rom. 8:28-30, Deut. 7:6-11, Gal. 4:22-23, Eph. 1:3-6
