- Read Romans 9:14-16. How does the context of Exodus
 33:18-19 help you understand this passage?
- 3. How do you understand God's hardening of Pharoah's heart to work? (see Rom 1:24, 26, 28) What does it look like for you to harden your heart to God? (see Heb 3:7-9, 12-15)
- 4. What difference does it make that God's mercy is given freely and sovereignly? What are some ways that we presume upon God's mercy at times?
- 5. Read Jeremiah 18:1-11, Isaiah 29:16, 45:9, 64:8-9. How does the Old Testament context help you understand what Paul is saying in Romans 9:19-24?
- 6. Do you see this passage as primarily about how God is working through Israel, or primarily about individual salvation? Why?
- 7. Read Romans 9:22-23. How has God shown you patience? How does it impact you to know that God's patience is not infinite?
- 8. Read Romans 9:25-29. How do these Old Testament verses explain God's plan for Israel?
