- 4. How does Israel's salvation relate to the end times in your understanding? (see Luke 21:25-28; Matt 23:37-39; Matt 24:14; Matt 19:28; Isa 2:2-4; Rev 7:9-10; Rev 20:1-6).
- 5. When you consider how big and all-encompassing God's plan is, how does this encourage you?
- 6. Consider the three supports Paul gives for confidence in God's future plan for Israel. Which stood out to you, and why?
- 7. What are some areas where we are tempted to apologize for God's Word rather than celebrate it as true and beautiful and good news?
- 8. Read Romans 11:29. How does it encourage you to know that God is a promise keeper? When are you tempted to doubt this?
- 9. Consider Paul's statement in 11:30-32 that "God has consigned all to disobedience that he may have mercy on all." How does this truth play itself out in our lives?
