- 5. Look over the list of grace gifts and consider the following:
 - a. Which do you think you might have?
 - b. How have you seen God use your gift throughout your life?
 - c. What questions do you have about it?
 - d. What spiritual gifts have you seen functioning within our church?
 - e. Can you identify the spiritual gifts of people in your group?
- 6. Read 1 Peter 4:10-11. According to this passage, how should we use our grace gifts? What does it look like to use your gift in dependence on Jesus?
- 7. Read Ephesians 4:7-14. According to this passage, who is called to be engaged in ministry? What is the role of gifts in this passage?
- 8. What was your biggest take-away from this week's message?
