## JESUS VS. CAESAR

Romans 13:1-7

We should have a posture of <u>SUBMISSION</u> towards the government—because it is instituted by GOD. 13:1-2

• We should have a posture of submission towards the government—because God uses it to provide MORAL and social ORDER. 13:3-4

 We should give honor where honor is due, but our submission to Caesar is LIMITED by our submission to God. 13:5-7

- 1. Read Romans 13:1-2. What questions do you have about these verses? What problems or issues do they raise in your mind?
- 2. Read Romans 12:19 and Romans 13:3-4. What role does the government play in avenging injustice? How is that different from how we are to approach injustices personally?
- 3. What does it look like to be a good citizen? (See Jer 29:7; 1 Pet 2:13-17; Tit 3:1-2; 1 Tim 2:1-5)
- 4. What role should our consciences play in submitting to the government, especially in relation to morally questionable laws?
- 5. Read Matthew 22:16-22. Explain Jesus' response. What does this tell us about Jesus' kingdom and Caesar's kingdom?
- 6. How would you respond to a governmental authority who guoted Romans 13:1 to you and claimed that you needed to obey his every command as a result?
- 7. What biblical examples of people defying government out of allegiance to God stand out to you? Why? What do we learn from these examples about Romans 13?
- 8. What are some examples of submission to our government that are difficult for you personally?
