- 3. How does Paul tell us that we balance our freedom in Christ with loving others in Romans 14:13-15?
- 4. How do we stop this from sliding into legalism where certain people hold the rest of the church hostage to their scruples?
- 5. Explain the statement by Peter Kreeft: "Be egalitarian regarding persons; be elitist regarding ideas." Do you find this to be true? Why or why not?
- 6. How does God's kingdom motivate us according to Romans 14:17-18? How do you interpret these three phrases in light of their usage in Romans 5:1-5?
- 7. Read Romans 14:19-21. What does it look like to chase peace and mutual upbuilding within God's family?
- 8. Read Romans 14:22-23. In what situations might we separate our private conscience from our public behavior? (see also 1 Cor 10:24-31)
