Trinitarian Hope

Romans 15:8–13

• <u>CHRIST</u> has a <u>DUAL</u> purpose in the <u>INCARNATION</u>. (vv 8-9a)

 <u>THE FATHER'S</u> plan has always <u>INCLUDED</u> the Gentiles. (vv 9b-12)

• <u>THE HOLY SPIRIT</u> grants us <u>PEACE</u> and <u>JOY</u> through <u>EAITH</u> in Christ, leading to <u>ABOUNDING HOPE</u>. (v 13)



FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

- 1. What is hope to a Christian? How does the Christian definition differ from the non-Christian definition? Romans 15:4, 1 Peter 1:3
- Read Romans 15:8-9a. How does Christ's coming show God's truthfulness and make it so that the Gentiles give glory to God for His mercy? Romans 1:16 (can you recite it?), Romans 4:16, Romans 11:29-30
- 3. Do you believe that God's plan of redemption included the Gentiles from the beginning? Why or why not?
- 4. Read Romans 15:9-12. In what ways do you see a progression in the way that the Gentiles are spoken of? How does the Gentiles' relationship to God change throughout those verses?
- 5. In what ways do we see a Messianic fulfillment when we compare verse 9b to verse 12? For some additional context, read Psalm 18:43 (Psalm 18:49 is cited in Romans 15:9), then Matthew 12:15-21 (which also quotes from Isaiah 11:10, which is cited in Romans 15:12).
- 6. See Romans 15:13. What are some areas of the Christian walk where faith must be given priority? What are some areas where love, grace, and peace must be given priority? Romans 10:9, Romans 14:17, Philippians 2:5-11, 1 Corinthians 10:31
- 7. Consider ways in which you are the "stronger brother." Consider ways in which you are the "weaker brother." How has our study of Romans 14:1-15:13 impacted your view of your personal convictions?
