- 1. Read Joel 2:11-13. How does the message about "the day of the Lord" prepare God's people for the plea in 2:12-13? How can judgment prepare people for mercy today?
- 2. How do we see God's heart for people to return to Him throughout the Bible? What passages stand out to you?
- 3. What does genuine repentance look like and how is it different from false repentance? What does it mean to "rend your heart"?
- 4. Read Psalm 51. What does repentance look like in terms of changing our hearts, our minds, and our lives?
- 5. Read Joel 2:13-14 and compare Exodus 34:6-7. Why must our return to God be based upon His character, and not on ourselves? (See also Mat 11:28-30)
- 6. Why must repentance be urgent? Why is non-urgent repentance problematic?
- 7. Read Joel 2:17. How does the priests intercession point towards Jesus? How does God identify with His people so that His reputation is bound up with us (see also Exo 32:12-14; Heb 2:17, 7:26-27, 10:19-23; 1 Tim 2:5-6)?
- 8. How did this message impact your life? Did the Lord prompt you to repent of any sin you feel comfortable sharing?
