- 7. Compare Jonah 1 and Jonah 3 (see below). What a parallels do you see? What does this tell us about what Jonah went through?
- 8. In what ways does Jonah point us to Jesus? See Matt 12:39-41, Mark 8:23-37? How are you encouraged by this study?
