- 2. How do you understand God's jealousy? How is it a right and good thing? See Exodus 20:5, 34:14, Num 25:11, Deut 4:23-24, Eze 39:25, Isa 48:10-11
- 3. Read Nahum 1:1-3. How is God's jealousy related to God's vengeance?
- 4. How should we think about our vengeance and God's vengeance? Psalm 94:1-7, Deut 32:35-36, Romans 12:19-21, Heb 10:30-31, Prov 20:22, Mat 5:38-42
- 5. In Nahum 1:3-10, how is God described? What stands out to you? Is this good news or bad news?
- 6. Read Nahum 1:11-15. Do you see God's judgment of Nineveh as representative of God's final judgment on the earth? Why or why not?
- 7. How is it that God's judgment was His people's victory in Nahum's day? How is this true in the cross, and how will it be true when Jesus' returns?
- 8. Looking back through this passage, how does bad news become good news? What makes the difference? How does this encourage you?
