- 1. Do you think that we should question God? Why or why not? How can we question God in a way that builds relationship with Him rather than destroys relationship with Him?
- 2. As a home group, consider reading Habakkuk 1-3 together. How would you summarize the main point of the entire book?
- 3. When have you felt similar to how Habakkuk feels in Habakkuk 1:1-4? Why? What parallels do you see in our society and nation to what Habakkuk is seeing?
- 4. Discuss what it means that "the Law is paralyzed" in verse 4. How can this happen today in our lives and in our society?
- 5. How does God's response in Habakkuk 1:5 bring you comfort and/or frustration? How can we expand our perspective so that we're not only focused on our circumstances? (see Isa 55:8-9, Isa 45:8-11, Isa 40:18-31, Prov 20:24, Job 38:1-42:6, Phil 2:3-4)
- 6. Read Habakkuk 1:6-11. What stands out to you about the Babylonians? Why do you think God describes them with such detail?
- 7. Consider the life of Joseph (Gen 37-50). How did God use evil for good purposes in his life (see Gen 50:19-21)?
- 8. What are some ways you've seen God use evil for good purposes throughout your life?
