HABAKKUK 1:12-2:5

Main Point: "The righteous shall live by faith"

Living by faith...

Means trusting in God as He <u>carries</u> out His <u>plan</u> with all people.

Means that our questions to God will not go unheard.

Is the continual lifestyle of God's people.

Means trusting that God will bring about <u>justice</u> and make all things right.

- 3. What injustices have you experienced or seen that have made you question God? Give some biblical examples of the right way to question God. e.g. Job, Ecclesiastes,
 Lamentations, Matt. 27:46; Job 42:7; Rev. 6:10; Psalm 62:5-8
- 4. How does waiting on God play a role in our own lives, and what challenges do we face in being patient? Hab. 2:1; Isaiah. 65:24.
- 5. Discuss what "the righteous shall live by faith" means. Rom. 1:16-17; Gal. 3:10-14; Heb. 10:37-39, Gen. 15:5-6; Rom. 4:3; 1 Cor. 1:30.
- 6. What current situations in your life or in what you see in our world are you having difficulty trusting in God's perfect plan? 2 Peter 3:1-4, Rom. 8:18-24; Rev. 7:9-12.
