## FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

- 1. Read 1 Samuel 1:1-8. What are the two voices to Hannah saying? What do the voices of our culture say to us? Where are we tempted to find our identity and significance?
- 2. Have you or anyone you've known ever struggled with infertility? How did you handle that? What makes that difficult? How do you think it was different in ancient Israelite culture?
- 3. Read 1 Samuel 1:9-11. How is Hannah's response instructive to us? What stands out to you about her prayer?
- 4. Read 1 Samuel 1:18-20. Is Hannah bargaining with God? When does Hannah get peace and joy? Why does the order of events matter here?
- 5. In our lives, what are some things we need to surrender to God? (See Phil 4:6-7; 1 Pet 5:6-7; Psalm 55:22; Matt 6:25-34; Phil 4:11-13; Heb 13:5; 1 Tim 6:6-10)
- 6. Compare Hannah's prayer (1 Sam 2:1-10) to Mary's prayer (Luke 1:46-55). What similarities do you see? How does Hannah's story point us to Jesus?
- 7. Read Romans 12:1. What does it mean to be a living sacrifice in light of this story?
