- Permanent Bond

(v. 10)

- Creates and Transforms
- Initiated by God

We value His <u>Covenant</u> as <u>worthless</u> when we divorce because: Divorce <u>Destroys</u> our Worship. (v11-12)

Divorce Hinders our Witness. (v13-15a)

Divorce is $\underline{\text{Hated}}$ like Violence, by God. (v15b-16)

Be **Double On-Guard** against this **Faithlessness**. (v16)
