## FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

- 1. How is your vision? Do you remember first getting glasses, what was that like?
- 2. Right now, would you say your vision of Jesus is sharp and crisp or a blurry blob of color? Why? Why is it important for us to have a clear and accurate vision of who Jesus is? Hebrews 1:1-3, 2 Cor 3:18.
- 3. Read Luke 1:1-4. What do you see in this passage that helps you have confidence in Jesus? What do you see in this passage that raises questions for you?
- 4. Have you ever studied the historical evidence for the Bible or the ways it's confirmed by archaeology? How has this impacted your faith in Jesus? How does this compare to other religions?
- 5. How would you describe how Jesus' fulfillment of the Old Testament to someone who did not understand this concept? (see Luke 24:25–27, Luke 24:44–47) What examples might you give?
- 6. Explain how the cross and the resurrection is central to Luke. Why do you think he made these the center of his message? How can we grow to have the cross and resurrection of Jesus be more central to our lives? (See 1 Cor 2:2, Heb 12:1-3, Phil 2:21)
- 7. What excites you about studying the book of Luke?
- 8. Take time to pray that God would use the book of Luke in your life and in our church to sharpen our vision of Jesus.
