FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

- 1. What are some different reactions people have to disappointment and discouragement? What does your default reaction tend to be?
- 2. Read Luke 1:5-7. How is Elizabeth's experience especially painful in an ancient Israelite culture? What would people think? How was this reflective of Israel in general? (see Isa 49:21, 54:1)
- 3. Read Luke 1:8-17 and the last few verses of the Old Testament. How is God picking up right where the Old Testament leaves off?
- 4. Read Luke 1:18–23. How can unbelief be sneaky as it was in Zechariah's heart? What does it look like to have a real, vibrant, living faith, versus having a faith that's on cruise control?
- 5. In your life, what disappointments have you faced and how did you respond?
- 6. What does it look like to have a living, vibrant faith in your life right now with what you're facing?
- 7. What is the difference between discipline and punishment? Do you ever feel God is punishing you? What does the gospel tell us about this? (see Hebrews 12:5–11)
- 8. Read Luke 1:24–25. How is it encouraging to see how God cares personally for Elizabeth? In your life, how is God caring for you personally?
