• Jesus is the Son of <u>God</u>, the Hope of <u>Israel</u>. (v. 21-23) (John 1:14, Luke 4:17-21, Luke 9:23)

• Jesus is the son of the <u>Promises</u>, the Hope of the <u>Scriptures</u>. (v. 24-38)

• Jesus is the son of <u>Adam</u>, the Hope for <u>Us</u>. (v. 38) (Ephesians 2:11-13, Luke 3:22, Luke 4:3, Romans 5:17, Colossians 1:26-27)

FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

- 1. Have you ever traced back your own family ancestry? What did you discover that may have surprised you?
- 2. Look at Matthew 1:1-17 compared to Luke 3:23-38. What are the differences and similarities? Given 2 Tim 3:16-17 how do each of these equip us?
- 3. Luke places the genealogy between Jesus' baptism (Luke 3:21-22) and temptation (Luke 4:1-13). How does this placement emphasize Jesus' identity and mission? How does it relate to our own identity and mission as followers of Christ?
- 4. The message discusses how Jesus fulfills the Adamic Covenant after Adam failed. Read Romans 5:14-19 and 1 Cor 15:21-22. What is your understanding of Jesus' role as the "second Adam?"
- 5. God is intentional, and people matter to Him individually. How does the detailed genealogy in Luke 3:23–38 reinforce this idea? How does it affect your personal relationship with God?
- 6. Brian noted that many people in Jesus' genealogy were "ordinary people" yet essential parts of God's kingdom plan. Where do you see your life playing a part in the story of Hope, which is redemption in Christ?
