Grace Upon Grace

John 1:15-18

"Jesus, the eternal son of God, is the embodiment of God's boundless **grace** and unwavering **truth**."

- Jesus is the <u>eternal</u> and preeminent <u>Light</u>, testified to by John the Baptist. (v. 15)
- Through Jesus, we receive <u>unending</u> grace upon grace, far surpassing the blessings of the old <u>covenant</u>.
- Jesus perfectly **embodies** grace and truth, fulfilling the law and offering salvation. (v. 17)
- Jesus, the only Son of God, <u>fully reveals</u> God's character, glory, and love. (v. 18)
