- 2. Read Revelation 2:2-5 and Luke 10:40-42. How can you fight against being distracted from Jesus? How can you personally grow in your prayer life this year?
- 3. Read Luke 6:13–16. How does God's calling the ordinary, flawed disciples encourage or challenge you? (1 Cor 1:26–29)
- 4. Which of the Apostles stands out to you and why? How does it impact you to know that God directed Jesus to chose Judas Iscariot as an apostle? Why would God do this?
- 5. What ministry is God calling you to right now? (see Eph 2:10, Eph 4:11-14, Tit 2:14, 1 Pet 4:10-11; Rom 12:6-7)
- 6. Read Luke 6:17–19. How is God's power related to Jesus' prayer in verse 12?
- 7. Have you ever felt inadequate for something God has called you to? How did you handle it or how did God provide?
- 8. What's your biggest takeaway from this week's message?
