DEATH AND TAXES

Luke 7:1-17

We can have courage in the face of death because...

Jesus responds to <u>humble faith</u>, not personal worthiness.
 7:1-10

Jesus responds with <u>compassion</u> to the broken-hearted and cares for us in our pain.
 7:11-15

Jesus stands as the supreme Prophet who <u>reveals</u> God's heart and conquers <u>death</u>.
 7:16-17



- 1. How do you think about death? Is there lingering fear in your heart? Have you ever seen someone face death with confidence and courage?
- 2. Read Luke 7:1-6. How does the Jew's concept of worthiness contrast with the centurion's idea of worthiness? What are some ways that Christians can allow a works-based mindset that sees their value as tied to their works to creep into their lives?
- 3. Read Luke 7:6-10. What do we learn about real faith in this passage? Why do you think Jesus is amazed at this man's faith?
- 4. What situation in your life do you need to see Jesus as able to handle, even though He may not be physically present?
- 5. Read Luke 7:11-15. How do we see Jesus' compassion in this passage? How does it comfort you to know that Jesus has real compassion for you? (see Matthew 11:28-30, Exodus 33:18-19, 34:5-7, Heb 4:15-16.)
- 6. How have you seen Jesus take care of you amidst loss, pain, and grief?
- 7. Read Luke 7:16-17, and consider the stories from the Old Testament that are echoed in these stories (2 Kings 5, 4:32-37, 1 Kings 17:19-24; see also Luke 4:24-27)? What is the significance of these echoes?
- 8. What does it mean that Jesus is the definitive revelation of God's heart? How does this encourage you? (see Heb 1:1–3, John 14:6–9, John 1:1. 14. 18)
