Luke 8:26-39

The Man: "No <u>Jesus</u>, No <u>Peace."</u> (v26-27) The Spiritual State of the Man: <u>Embattled</u>, <u>Ashamed</u>, <u>Separated</u>, <u>Hopeless</u>

The Demons: "Know (of) <u>Jesus."</u> (v28-33) Even the demons know of Jesus' <u>Authority</u>, <u>Mercy</u>, & <u>Victory</u>

The People: "No <u>Jesus</u>!" (v34-37) The Healed State of the Man: <u>Peaceful</u>, <u>Clothed</u>, in <u>Community</u>, <u>Alive.</u>

The Man: "Know Jesus. Know <u>Peace</u>." (v38-39) When Jesus heals him, he wants to: <u>Know, Follow</u> & <u>Witness.</u>

FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

- Have you ever dealt with a situation where you felt spiritually embattled or under demonic oppression? How did you deal with it? Ref 1 Peter 5:8-10, Ephesians 6:10-18, James 4:7-10
- 2. The message described the man as "embattled, ashamed, separated, and hopeless." How have these four conditions shown up in your struggles or challenges?
- 3. Jesus intentionally crossed the storm to reach this one man. What does this suggest about Jesus' mission and his view of individuals? His view of you personally?
- The demons "know" who Jesus is. (Luke 8:28–31) How is that different from how we "know" Jesus as believers? Ref James 2:19, 1 Cor 10:20–21, Eph 4:15, Romans 12:1–2
- Brian suggests we should "acknowledge who He is, and who we are." What does that mean? Ref 1 John 1:9-10, Luke 19:10
- 6. The healed man wanted to "know, follow, and witness." As someone who has been forgiven and transformed by Jesus, how will you reflect this in your life this week?
