

SIGNS AND LIGHTS

Luke 11:29–36

- I. Jesus is the only **Sign** we need. (vv 29-30)

- II. Ignoring the **Sign** brings Condemnation. (vv31-32)

- III. The **Light** is Plain to See. (vv33)

- IV. Those Who Receive the **Light** Become **Light**. (vv34-36)

FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

1. Have you ever asked God for a “sign” before making a decision? Why do you think people keep searching for something “more” even when the truth is right in front of them? See Luke 11:29; John 20:26–29; Hebrews 11:1,6
2. What is the “sign of Jonah” and why is that sufficient? See Luke 11:30; Jonah 1:17; Matthew 12:40; Acts 2:22–24, 32–34, 37–39; 1 Corinthians 2:1–2.
3. Jesus says that “no one lights a lamp and hides it.” What does this tell us about God’s desire to be seen and known? See Luke 11:33; John 1:9–14, 3:19–21, 8:12, 28.
4. What does Jesus mean when He says, “be careful lest the light in you be darkness”? How do we, as Believers, think of this, versus a non-Believer? See Luke 11:34–35; 2 Corinthians 13:5–6; 1 John 1:5–9; Ephesians 2:8.
5. How does this passage encourage you?
6. In what areas of life might you be covering or dimming the light Jesus has placed in you? What would it look like to “give light” more openly this week? See 2 Corinthians 4:1–10.
