FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

1. Have you ever seen or experienced a physical miracle like the one described in this passage? Tell your home group about how God moved in your life or the life of someone you know in a miraculous way.
2. Discuss what it suggests that Jesus calls out to the woman, rather than her coming to Him in verse 12. Consider also the way that Jesus proclaims what will happen. What does that tell you about Jesus' authority?
3. Consider sharing with your home group some of the sin that once enslaved you that Jesus has saved you from. You may consider splitting by gender to encourage more open sharing. Be sure to be humble and celebrate these victories together as a group, and always give glory to God, as the woman does in verse 13.
1 Timothy 1:15, Romans 3:23, Philippians 1:6, 2 Peter 3:8
4. Read verses 14-16. In addition to the passage, you may want to look up Mishnah Shabbat 7:2 and Mishnah Eruvin 4:7:3 online. These are not Bible passages but later Jewish writings that help us understand the kinds of cultural traditions and rules the synagogue ruler would have been operating under. What was the charge against Jesus, if any? What about against the people, if any?
5. How is Jesus' argument from "lesser to greater" effective? Are there other places that you can think of this argumentation technique being used in Scripture?

6. Discuss how we can be both bound to Christ and free in Christ. How does this give you hope moving forward into the next week?
