Luke 19:11-27

We are either all in or all out. If we call Jesus, "LORD", then we need to act like it and use what He has given us, for His kingdom.

Following Jesus means **working** for His kingdom.

Our only **faithful** response is **full** submission.

FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

1. The message began by contrasting "quiet, convenient Christianity" with the cost of following Jesus in Egypt. How might our comfortable context in America promote complacency?
2. See Luke 19:13. Each servant receives the same amount. What does this teach us about responsibility, opportunity, and accountability in the kingdom of God?

(See Romans 12:4-8; Eph 2:8-10; 1 Cor 15:57-58; 1 Peter 4:10-11)

3. Why do you think the nobleman praises *faithfulness* rather than *results*? How does this reshape the way we think about obedience and success?
4. Consider the following areas:
 - a. Relationships: What would faithfulness look like this week for you?
 - b. Temecula Hills: What is one concrete step toward serving or discipling here?
 - c. The Nations: What is one way -- praying, giving, encouraging, or going -- that God is calling you to participate in? What keeps you from taking that step?

Reflection: *Where am I making excuses rather than being obedient?*
