- In the Lord's Supper, Jesus gives us a lasting **REMEMBRANCE** of His sacrifice and invites us to receive Him as the true source of **LIFE**. *Luke 20:19-23*

FURTHER UP, FURTHER IN

1. Read Luke 22:1-6. What different forces are aligned against Jesus in this passage? In your life, what forces feel like they are coming against you right now?
2. Judas was close to Jesus, yet betrayed Him. What warnings does his life give us? (see Ephes. 6:12, 1 Cor. 10:12-13, 2 Pet. 3:17-18, Heb. 3:12-13, 2 Pet. 1:10)
3. Read Luke 22:7-13. What details in the passage show us God's sovereignty? (see also Acts 2:23, Acts 4:26-28, Luke 22:22). In your life, where do you need to recognize God's sovereignty?
4. How does the Passover background to the Last supper help you see it more clearly (see Exodus 12, 1 Cor 5:7, John 1:29, Gen 22)? In what ways are people tempted to provide their own lambs instead of trusting Christ?
5. Read Luke 22:14-18. Jesus says He will not eat this meal again until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God. How does the promise of a future meal with Christ shape your hope and perspective on life today?
6. Read Luke 22:19-20. What questions do you still have about communion—theological or personal?
7. How has taking communion personally been an encouragement in your life? How has it fed your soul to remember Jesus?
8. After hearing this sermon, what is one area where you sense God calling you to stop “feeding” on something else and begin trusting Christ more fully?
